Ideas/Research

Tells about event/s or time

Tells only true information

Includes a title that relates closely to the story

Relates an event or sequence of events in time order

Includes beginning, middle and end

Includes a personal reaction to what happened (closure)

Includes pictures that match text

Includes labels and captions on pictures


Language Style

Uses first person for personal narratives

Uses transition words (first, next, etc.) temporal words?

Uses descriptive words


