## Writing Criteria: B

### Key Skills and Understanding

**Narrative Writing- Fictional:** Fictional narratives are about an imagined event or scenario created by the author.

### Ideas/Research

Generates ideas

Tells about imaginary event

Includes related details

### Organization/Text Features

Includes a title that relates closely to the story

Relates an event or sequence of events in time order

Includes beginning, middle and end

Includes a sense of closure

Includes pictures that match text

Includes labels and captions on pictures

### Language Style

Uses first or third person for fictional narratives

Uses temporal words to signal event order (first, next, etc.)

Uses descriptive words

Uses action words
